Nomination Guidelines & Instructions

Nominations must be received by Thursday, August 31 2017 at 5:00 pm Pacific. Nominations will NOT be accepted after the deadline.

Nominations for any award may be submitted by an individual or an organization. Nominators do not have to be members of AFP.

Before nominating, the nominee must be contacted to make certain that they will accept the award (if chosen) and attend the awards luncheon event on November 14, 2017.

All nominations must include an essay of no more than 1,500 words that addresses all of the criteria outlined for the award. Nominations will be judged solely on the responses to the criteria. It is recommended that nominators retype each of the criteria as sub-headers and answer each prompt separately in the nomination essay.

Nominators must submit (1) [nomination form](#), (2) [essay](#), and (3) [letters of support](#) via email to kgood@marshallmedical.org by **Thursday, August 31 2017 at 5:00 pm Pacific**. The email subject line must state the full name of the nominee and the award category, "Full Name, Award Category" (e.g. John Smith, Outstanding Philanthropist).

Supporting documents (brochures, videos, newspaper articles, etc.) are not allowed. Incomplete nominations will not be considered.

Collaborative nominations are encouraged. While not required, letters of support are highly recommended. A maximum of three (3) letters of support will be accepted for each nomination. Letters of support may be submitted separately via email to kgood@marshallmedical.org by Thursday, August 31 2017 at 5:00 pm Pacific. With the subject line, "Letter of Support, Nominee Name" (e.g. Letter of Support, ABC Foundation).

Award Categories & Criteria

Outstanding Philanthropist Award

This award is presented to an individual, couple, or family with a proven record of exceptional generosity who, through direct financial support, has demonstrated outstanding civic and charitable responsibility, and whose generosity encourages others to take philanthropic leadership roles in the El Dorado County, or at a national and/or international level.

1. Describe the nominee's participation in and direct financial support of nonprofit organizations in our community, and the impact of the nominee's gift and work on the organizations and in the community.
2. Provide evidence of the nominee's work in encouraging and motivating others to take leadership roles in philanthropy (i.e. challenge gifts, matching gifts, volunteering, etc.)
3. Describe the nominee's leadership and/or philanthropic support of innovative, creative, or collaborative approaches to addressing community needs.

Outstanding Corporation in Philanthropy

This award honors a corporation or its corporate foundation that demonstrates outstanding commitment through financial support and through encouragement and motivation of others to take leadership roles toward philanthropy and community involvement.

1. For each major cause, initiative or nonprofit supported by the nominee, include description of philanthropic support (money, time and other resources), (2) innovation and creativity in addressing the issue or cause, and (3) impact of that support on those causes and nonprofits.
2. Description of additional gift support and achievements accomplished through the corporation's efforts.
3. Description of overall gift support by the nominee and general approach and philosophy to philanthropy and charitable support.
4. Description of the nominee's work in encouraging and motivating others (e.g. employees, clients, customers, the public) to get involved with and/or take leadership roles in philanthropy.

Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award

This award is presented to an individual youth or college student (age 21 and under) who has demonstrated outstanding commitment to the community through direct financial support, development of charitable programs, volunteering, and leadership in philanthropy. **The recipient of this award will receive a \$500 scholarship for college expenses.**

1. Describe in detail the nominee's accomplishments including goals, process, and other people involved in the process (adult leaders or advisers, etc.), the time, talent and/or financial support the nominee provided to a nonprofit organization or cause, and the results of those efforts.
2. Describe in detail the impact of the nominee's work on the community.
3. Provide evidence the nominee takes a leadership role and encourages others to become involved in philanthropy and community service.

Selection Process & Eligibility

Members of the National Philanthropy Day Awards Selection Committee review and score all nominations according to the criteria provided. The Awards Selection Committee consists may include community leaders, previous honorees, past Philanthropy Day leadership, and regional AFP leaders.

Nominations are evaluated using scoring criteria specific to each award category. For nominations to be considered complete, each scoring criteria must be addressed separately, and incomplete nominations will not be considered. The most compelling nominations address in measureable ways how the nominee has directly impacted specific organizations and causes. Judges may choose not to present an award for any category where no nominee meets the criteria. All decisions of the Selection Committee are final.

AFPCCC's current President, President Elect, and National Philanthropy Day Awards Committee Chairs are ineligible to receive an award. Previous honorees are ineligible for seven (7) years after receipt of their award
